STUDENT PLACEMENT FOR THE 2024/2025 SCHOOL YEAR

We will be holding student placement meetings during the month of May to arrange classes for September. Current teachers, the Learning Assistance Teacher, who co-ordinates our student support services at the school, and school Administration will also attend. The development of class lists is given a great deal of time, careful thought and understanding with the knowledge teachers have of each student and what will be in the child's best interest. Because teachers see how students function in a classroom every day, they are confident that they can make the best class placement possible for your child.

Parents will also be beginning to think about what is best for their children in terms of their class placement for 2024/2025 at Casorso. While there are many things that must be considered when we make up classes, and we are somewhat limited in what we can do to accommodate 'wish lists', we encourage parents to be involved and provide information that will help us make good decisions. We always want to do what is best for children and families and therefore value any requests for placement that involve grade/class configuration, and those that involve a preferred placement regarding another child or friends. However, we cannot consider requests for specific teachers, and requests must have an educationally sound explanation behind them.

We will gladly be accepting requests in writing (paper or email) up until May 20th

It should be noted that combined or 'split' classes are not necessarily homogenously grouped (see more information regarding combined classrooms under the 'Parents' tabs of our website). For example, the more academically advanced grade 4 students are not automatically placed in a Grade 4/5 class with 'weaker' grade 5 students. There are many factors that are taken into account in the process:

- Relative independence
- Special needs
- Learning and teaching styles
- Previous placement history
- Social groupings

- Instructional groupings
- Class size
- Gender balance
- School Based Team recommendations
- Academic achievement

We will re-assess the class and school organization after the August registration period when we become aware of any enrolment changes that have taken place over the summer. As is the case every year in all schools, teaching assignments and class organizations are subject to change in the fall.

<u>Please Note</u>: Parents hold on to your child's report card! <u>You will need it to obtain your child's P.E.N. number</u>. Class lists posted in September will show the student P.E.N. numbers only. Due to the Freedom of Information Act, we are no longer allowed to post student names.



Social Emotional Learning

Even though Social and Emotional Learning and mental health are different, SEL can help improve mental health in several ways. It does this by encouraging good relationships, safe environments where emotions are respected, and teaching important skills. These things help protect against mental health problems. NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR KLO PAC EXECUTIVE FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR

A new Ecole KLO Middle School Parent Advisory Council (PAC) executive will be elected for the 2024-25 school year at the **AGM on May 27**th **at 6:30 p.m**. in the KLO library.

All parents/guardians of current grades 7 to 9 KLO students are automatically members of the KLO PAC, and parents with students coming into grade 7 in September 2024, are invited to the AGM and encouraged to consider letting your name stand for a PAC Executive position.

Although some existing PAC executive members are willing to let their name stand again, there are also vacancies (see below). KLO is required to have a PAC executive to continue receiving BC Gaming Grant Funding of over \$20,000 annually. These funds, administered by PAC, help fund KLO extracurriculars – class field trips, new kiln, music equipment, new sports uniforms and so much more.

Electing the new PAC Executive in May allows transition time before the end of this school year.

All positions are one-year terms. More information on the roles is available in the <u>PAC Constitution &Bylaws</u>.

Even if you are unable to serve as an executive member, your vote at the PAC meeting is needed to elect nominees into the positions.

If you would like to nominate yourself or someone else, please email klo.pac@sd23.bc.ca If we receive more nominations than positions, that would be a great position for this PAC to be in!

We are also happy to answer any questions. There can also be nominations from the floor at the AGM.

Even if you can't volunteer for a position, the PAC Executive welcomes your input and attendance at all meetings. It's an easy way to keep up with what is happening at KLO.

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only. You are required to have a valid email account.

No internet access? Please contact your school for assistance.

Online applications begin on Monday, January 29, 2024 at 7:00 am. Applications will be assigned a datetime stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school in person or by email by Friday, March 15, 2024.

- 1. Student's Birth Certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
- 2. Proof of Parent/Guardian B.C. Residency
 - Combination BC Driver's License and Services Card (copy of both sides); or,
 - b. BC Services Card (copy of both sides) and one item from the list of supporting documentation below; or,
 - c. Proof of application for BC Medical Services Plan and one item from the list of supporting documentation below.
- 3. Proof of Parent/Guardian Living Address/Supporting Documentation
 - Ownership of a dwelling or long-term lease or rental of a dwelling;
 - Documentation indicating British Columbia residence (i.e. utility bill);
 - British Columbia registration of an automobile;
 - British Columbia Driver's License (copy of both sides); or,
 - A current income tax return filed as a British Columbia resident.

AFTER Thursday, August 29, 2024

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2024, to qualify for school enrollment in September 2024. No exceptions.

Safety is everyone's responsibility
