ROOTS OF EMPATHY 2025 - 2026



Arthur has begun visiting Mrs. Jaworski's grade 2 class this year as a part of Roots of Empathy.

The goals of the program are:

- To foster the development of empathy
- To develop emotional literacy
- To reduce levels of bullying, aggression, and promote pro-social behaviours
- To increase knowledge of human development, learning, and infant safety
- To prepare students for responsible citizenship and responsive parenting

Started in 1996, Roots of Empathy is an evidence-based classroom program that has shown significant effect in reducing levels of aggression among schoolchildren while helping them develop social/emotional competencies and increasing empathy. At the heart of the program are a neighborhood infant (Arthur) and parents who engage students in their classroom. Over the school year, a trained Roots of Empathy Instructor guides the children as they observe the relationship between baby and parent, understanding the baby's intentions and emotions. Through this model of experiential learning, the baby is the "Teacher" and a catalyst, helping children identify and reflect on their own feelings and the feelings of others. 


Daily registration means you can choose 1, 2, 3, or all 4 days of camp!
