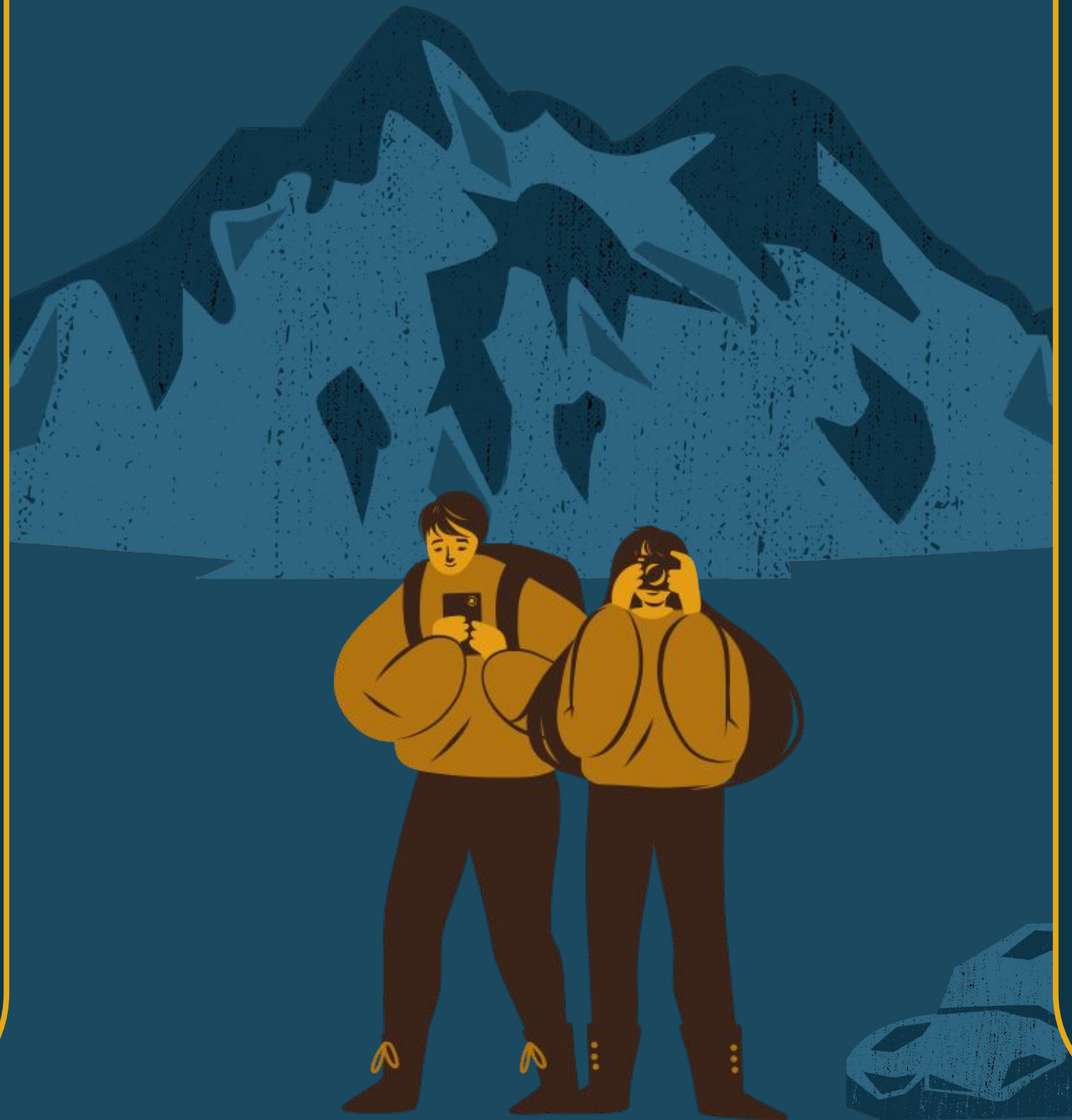

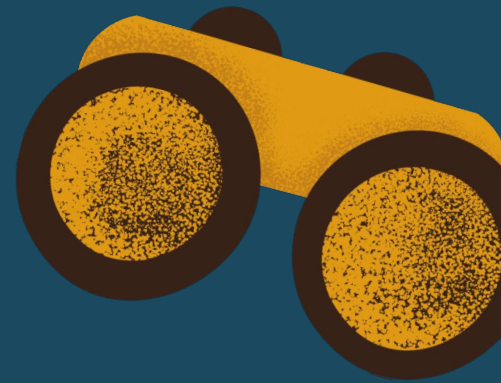

Responsibilities for parent chaperones

- ★ Load and transport student luggage (to and from casorso)
- ★ Stay in a "same gender" room to supervise a group of students
- ★ Supervise activity rotations (led by camp counselors/instructors)
- ★ Help prepare and put out extra snacks
- ★ Be flexible to help deal with any situations or changes
- ★ Stay responsible for lodge and activity groups during eating times and freetimes



How we choose chaperones...



- ★ Priority goes to parents of special needs students and those with medical training
- ★ We try to have a parent from each of the classes (mix of French/English)
- ★ Must have a completed criminal record check at the office by the end of January
- ★ It may come to a random draw if necessary
- ★ Parents will be informed some time in February
- ★ We ask that each chaperone pays \$50 to cover the costs of meals and overnight fee, we will fundraise the price for your accommodation in the lodge



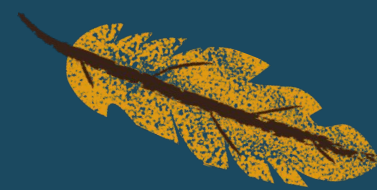
Parent Paperwork

- ★ Only parents with **current criminal record check** will be considered.
 - *This takes time so please contact the office ASAP to ensure yours is current.*
- ★ We need a copy of the completed criminal record check when you get it back as well as your ID.
- ★ It is much quicker getting the paperwork from the office than going through the RCMP.

Movie night - Grades 3-6 after school in the gym

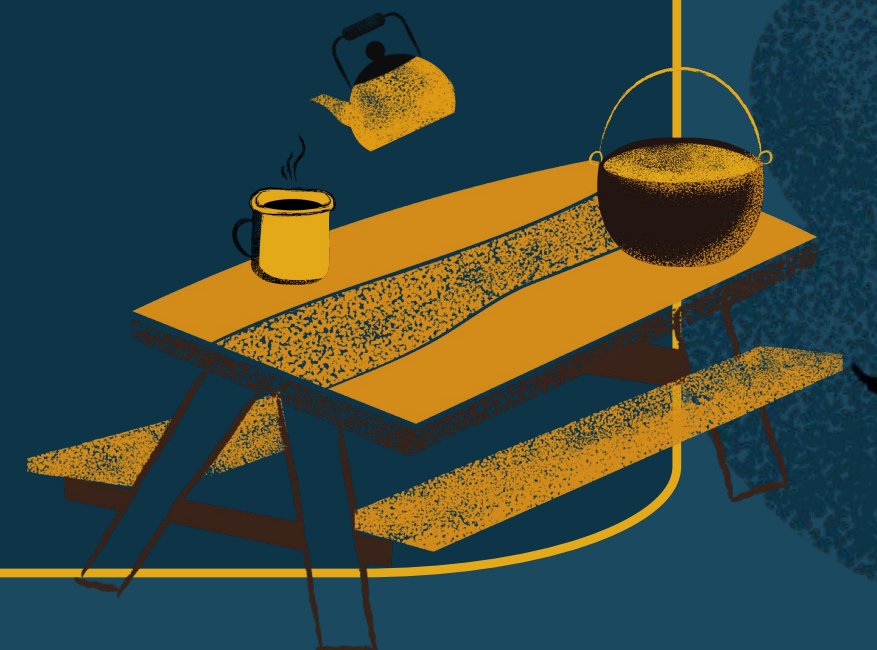
Cookie dough sales, Poinsettia sales

Forms and payment:

Carefully go through the **permission forms** and **waivers** when they are sent home and return to your child's teacher - around spring break
Record any **special dietary** or **medication needs** on the forms sent home in April

Pay the ~\$120 or contact the office if necessary (online payment will be set up)

\$50 deposit by December 1st to confirm your child is attending camp
