We are currently processing registrations for the **2025 - 2026** school year. If you child will **not** be returning to Casorso, please let their teacher or the Office know at your earliest convenience.

(Please note: if your child is currently in Grade 6, this message is not intended for you!)

STUDENT PLACEMENT FOR THE 2025/2026 SCHOOL YEAR

We will be holding student placement meetings during the month of May to arrange classes for September. Present teachers, the Learning Assistance Teacher (who co-ordinates our student support services), the School Counsellor, and the Principal will attend. The development of class lists is given a great deal of time, careful thought and understanding with the knowledge teachers have of each student and what will be in the child's best interest. Because teachers see how students function in a classroom every day, they are confident that they can make the best class placement possible for your child.

Parents will also be beginning to think about what is best for their children in terms of their class placement for 2025/2026 at Casorso. While there are many things that must be considered when we make up classes, and we are somewhat limited in what we can do to accommodate 'wish lists', we encourage parents to be involved and provide information that will help us make good decisions. We always want to do what is best for children and families and therefore value any requests for placement that involve grade/class configuration, and those that involve a preferred placement regarding another child or friends. However, we cannot consider requests for specific teachers, and requests must have an educationally sound explanation behind them.

We will gladly be accepting requests in writing or by email up until 3:00 pm, May 16th

It should be noted that combined or 'split' classes are not necessarily homogenously grouped (see more information regarding combined grade classes under the 'Communication' \Rightarrow 'Parents' tabs of our website). For example, the more academically advanced grade 4 students are not automatically placed in a Grade 4/5 class with 'weaker' grade 5 students. There are many factors that are taken into account in the process:

Relative independence	Special needs
 Learning and teaching styles 	 Previous placement history
 Social groupings 	 Instructional groupings
Class size	Gender balance
 School Based Team recommendations 	Academic achievement

We will re-assess the class and school organization after the August registration period as we become aware of any enrolment changes that have taken place over the summer. As is the case every year in all schools, teaching assignments and class organizations are subject to change in the fall. Class lists will be posted at the front of the school on the Friday before the first day of school in September.

<u>Please Note</u>: Parents hold on to your child's report card! <u>You will need it to obtain your child's P.E.N. number</u>. Class lists posted will show the student P.E.N. numbers only. Due to the Freedom of Information Act, we are no longer allowed to post student names.

We are asking for monetary donations to reach our annual fundraising goal of \$15,000.


How the Funds Are Utilized:

Guidelines: Issuance of Charitable Tax Receipts for PAC Donations

PAC's are not registered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) as a charitable organizations. As such, PACs cannot issue tax receipts themselves.

However, the SD23 Board of Education is a CRA registered charitable organization and is entitled to issue income tax deductible receipts for scholarship donations and donations for other educational purposes.

The SD23 Board of Education Policies 730 & 730R establish the definitions and rules for donations and tax receipting.

To determine if a donation is eligible for a tax deductible receipt, please consult SD23 policies and your school principal.

If it is determined that a donation is eligible for a tax receipt, your PAC may direct donors as follows:

Option A - For Donors With Students Enrolled in SD23

- Direct donors to https://centralokanagan.schoolcashonline.com/ (a user account must be created)
- Once the donor is logged in, direct them as follows:
 - Select "Make a Donation", enter the amount (minimum \$20 to receive a tax receipt)
 - b. Select "Fund Destination" for the donation (e.g. the recipient school name)
 - In the "Message to School Board" section indicate the donation's purpose (e.g. "Donation for the KLO Modular Farm")
 - d. A tax receipt will be automatically issued at checkout.







Option B - For Donors With or Without Students Enrolled in SD23

Write a cheque to School District 23 (minimum \$20 to receive a tax receipt)

- Indicate the purpose of the donation in the notes section of the cheque. Be as specific as possible and be sure to include the school's name.
- Attach a letter requesting a tax receipt from SD23 and include your mailing address.


